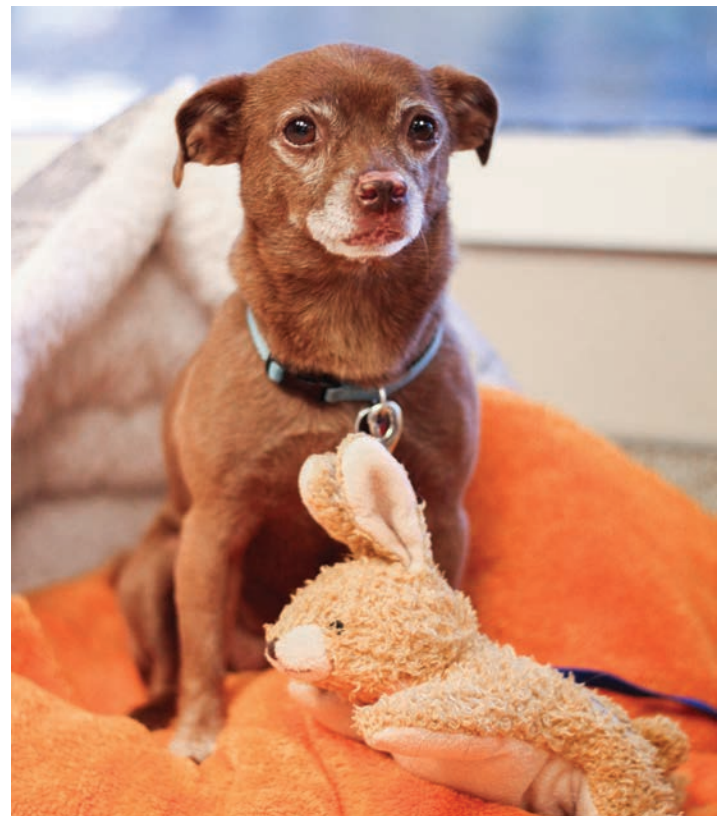

Arthritis in Dogs and Cats

Those of us lucky enough to have a pet in their golden years realize that, as with people, there are a number of changes a body undergoes with age. Dogs and cats may experience osteoarthritis as they age, and it is important to recognize the symptoms of this debilitating disease and seek treatment to ensure the comfort of our pets.

At least 25% of dogs will be diagnosed with arthritis during their lifetimes, and between 40 to 90% of cats will experience arthritis. Osteoarthritis is typically a degenerative joint disease. Joint cartilage is progressively lost, which causes bone-on-bone friction, leading to pain and decreased mobility of the affected joints. Symptoms include stiffness after rest, limping or lameness after overexertion, swelling of joints, frequent changing of positions while resting, anxiety, irritability, restlessness, an inability to jump or climb stairs, lack of interest in exercise and/or difficulty getting into or out of the litter box.

Although it is not possible to cure arthritis, there are therapies which will slow the progression of the disease and allow your pet to live a more comfortable, happy life. The most successful treatment for arthritis combines multiple options for the best outcome. Proper nutrition, medical management, weight control, appropriate exercise, supplements and a comfortable, warm, supportive place to rest all can make a difference.

Weight control is one of the most helpful components of successfully managing arthritis. Any excess weight on an affected pet's body will exacerbate arthritis. If your pet is obese, daily low-impact exercise, such as swimming or walking, in conjunction with a healthy, well-balanced diet, should be used to help your pet reach a healthy weight.

Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) are useful for managing arthritis, more so in dogs than cats. Analgesic drugs may also be helpful and include Tramadol, Gabapentin, Codeine and Amantadine. Side effects are possible and use should always be overseen by a veterinarian. Chondroprotective agents like glucosamine may slow the breakdown of cartilage and in some instances can provide the ingredients to help build it back up. A number of over-the-counter and injectable joint supplements are available for dogs. Never give your pet medications or supplements without first consulting your vet.



Nontraditional therapies for arthritis in pets are becoming more mainstream. These include acupuncture, chiropractic, hydrotherapy (underwater treadmill exercise or swimming), stem cell therapy, and cold laser therapy. All of these therapies are available locally in Southern Oregon.

Dogs and cats communicate pain and mobility issues through body language. Talk to your veterinarian about how to recognize the symptoms of osteoarthritis and how you might plan to manage your pet's disease process to ensure continued years of comfort and happiness.

SoHumane finds homes for more than 1,000 dogs and cats each year. Volunteers help make providing exceptional care possible for these pets. Foster volunteers provide a temporary home for dogs and cats that need veterinary treatment, a break from the shelter environment to de-stress, and for puppies/kittens that are not old enough to be made available for adoption.

SoHumane would not survive kitten season without foster homes. Countless kittens would go without care and would likely not live without a foster family to care for them.
