Originally eight-year-old Zig was surrendered to SoHumane by his owners who felt he was too active. After three months he was adopted. But two years later staff discovered that Zig had been surrendered once again, this



time at another shelter. Our hearts sank as we realized Zig was without a home, an eleven-year-old, big, black dog in a world where senior animals often struggle to find a second or third chance at life.

Once at SoHumane, Zig was loved and well taken care of, but his situation was disheartening. People passed him by day in and day out. Zig and his newfound canine companion quickly became fast friends, and the family didn't hesitate to say "YES" to giving Zig the loving home he deserved. Now Zig resides on a beautiful farm, spending each day with Grace and a family

that understands the value of every one of his gray hairs. Zig's story demonstrates the power of second chances and the gift of receiving enduring love. Triumph's arrival at SoHumane during the summer was the beginning of his remarkable journey. Found by caring community members, Triumph was experiencing a health crisis which included a severe burn on his head, burns on three of his paws, and an infestation of fleas. He was very underweight

for a young kitten, and he suffered from both hypothermia and anemia due to his burns and the fleas covering his body. SoHumane's vet care team acted swiftly by tending to the wounds on his head and paws and keeping him warm. They then treated Triumph for fleas and administered antibiotics, vitamins, and parasite preventatives.

Despite his initial challenges, Triumph's loving personality and determination were evident. He showed a strong will to survive. Triumph received

the veterinary attention he needed to heal, and staff quickly bonded with him. After a month of intensive treatment he had gained weight, the wound on his head was healing and the bandages were removed from his paws. Triumph's story is a testament to the resilience of the animals in our care. We are thrilled



to share that Triumph was adopted by one of SoHumane's most dedicated cat volunteers when he became available. He is now in a loving home where he will live an amazing life filled with love and comfort.
