His guardian, a veteran living on a limited income, had opened his home to stray cats, hoping to provide them with a comfortable home. However, as caring for so many cats became overwhelming, he realized he simply couldn't

meet their many needs. Worried that one of his beloved feline companions desperately needed more care than he could provide, the gentleman posted on social media, pleading for help. When SoHumane staff saw his message, we acted quickly to bring Smoke into our adoption program.

Smoke was a special case; as a senior black cat with medical needs, finding him a home would be challenging. Although he arrived in rough shape with dental disease, enlarged lymph nodes, ocular and nasal discharge, dirty ears, fleas and matted fur, staff were determined to give him a second chance. Your generosity not only makes opportunities for veterinary treatments possible but also allows every dog and cat the time they need to find their new families. After receiving essential veterinary care, Smoke was adopted and is thriving, surrounded by warmth and love in his forever home.

At SoHumane we are reminded that small miracles happen every day. This fall staff were contacted about ten abandoned dogs who were living in a car and who were in desperate need of help. The pups were quickly brought to SoHumane and examined by the vet care staff. Unfortunately the five boys and five girls (Diego, Dash, Duke, Duncan, Diesel, Dottie, Duchess, Daisy, Daphne and Diva) were in critical condition; eight of the ten

little dogs were suffering from advanced dental disease, causing them unimaginable pain. To complicate matters, six of the dogs were older and three were believed to have heart murmurs. Their situation was dire as they would require extensive dental care to find relief.

The average cost of a complicated dental procedure is an amount that many families simply cannot afford. Untreated dental disease often leads to a heartbreaking fate for animals in shelters, where lifesaving care is frequently unattainable due to limited funds. Thanks to the unwavering support of our donors, SoHumane is able to step in and provide essential veterinary care, ensuring that animals with treatable medical conditions have the chance to live pain-free healthy lives.

The ten rescued dogs are receiving the gift of hope — a chance at a new life and the opportunity to find loving homes and families.
