she had ever known. Sadly, we quickly discovered she was in desperate need of veterinary care. Our team removed foxtails and burrs and determined that she had ear and skin infections. Cupcake also had horrible teeth and would need dental care. After Cupcake's health stabilized, she had her remaining eleven teeth extracted during surgery. She then started treatment for her ears and skin and went to recover in a loving foster home.

Cupcake's foster mom wrote a note to her future adopters, "I can't say enough good things about this sweet, happy little girl. My family fell in love with her. She has a little piece of my heart, and she deserves to go to a home where she will be loved and spoiled!"

When Cupcake was ready to be adopted, we learned that Delores, a long time SoHumane supporter, had lost her dear poodle and had been crying every day until she saw Cupcake on our website. Delores was overjoyed to meet Cupcake and immediately made plans to adopt her. After Cupcake was settled in her home Dolores wrote to staff, "We are all doing fine. She has gained five pounds, runs



through the house and is well behaved. We all love her so much. Thank you, thank you for Cupcake."

When SoHumane staff first met Wesley, he was a tiny four-week-old kitten with an infection in his left eye. He was given antibiotics and placed in a caring foster home. Later his foster parent reported that he was wheezing, had watery



eyes and was losing weight. With his health deteriorating, a breathing treatment was begun. A further exam determined that Wesley had a badly ulcerated eye. After more than two months of intensive foster care, Wesley's general health and eyes had improved, and he was made available for adoption.

Little Wesley had an engaging personality. After adopting, his new mom wrote a love note, "I feel that Wesley chose me. Each day when I would clean his kennel and give him snuggles (all animals at SoHumane are treated like family and get so much love), this little guy would literally jump out onto my shoulders and not want me to go. I kept saying; if he's not adopted tomorrow I'm bringing him home. Two weeks of me saying the same thing, and we made it official. Working with animals is amazing, rewarding, and so important. We love you, Mr. Wesley." Foster families save

Susie came to SoHumane on the Saving Train last spring. Unfortunately, Susie had not been well cared for and was likely in terrible pain. During her veterinary exam, the vet care staff noted that Susie had severe tartar formation and gum recession on all of her canines and incisors. She was also missing ten teeth.

Over 80% of dogs over the age of three have active dental disease. Good dental health is critically important to a dog's overall well-being. Sadly, many dogs never receive dental care, which can lead to severe health problems, make eating painful, or even shorten their lifespan. Because Susie's health was at risk from the severity of her dental disease, staff scheduled her for surgery. Her dental surgery included eleven extractions plus cleaning and polishing. After a period of recovery, Susie was quickly adopted by a wonderful family.

A few weeks after she was adopted, we learned that not only did Susie find the perfect home she also found the perfect job! That's right, Susie goes to work every day with her mom at Abbett and Associates. Susie



welcomes patients as they arrive and visits with them in the lobby while they wait for their dental procedures. Susie's mom shared "She is absolutely the sweetest snuggle bug in the entire world!
