He had a wound and scabs on his tail and at some point Eeyore had suffered an injury to his left back foot. Upon examination it was determined that he was missing nine teeth, and several teeth were fractured. A sad sight at best, Eeyore desperately needed the help that SoHumane could provide. The vet care team cleaned his fur, treated his tail injury, began his vaccine series and administered medications for parasites. Eeyore had a warm, clean place to sleep, plenty of

nutritious food and people who cared for him. The vet care team regularly cleaned and bandaged his tail wound which was slow to heal. He was neutered and received a dental exam which included cleaning and an extraction. In late spring with his tail finally healed, his long soft grey fur brushed and clean Eeyore was ready for a home. The vet care team had all fallen in love with his loving and gentle nature. "Eeyore was one of the most patient of patients. He was a big talker, loved having his belly brushed, and gave the best kisses."
