I am happy to say that I have just celebrated my fourth anniversary at SoHumane. Time definitely flies when you're having fun and saving lives. 2019 has proven to be a productive year in many ways. We have been awarded a Platinum Seal of Transparency again by GuideStar and maintained a Four Star rating from Charity Navigator. We were honored for the third year in a row to be nominated Best Community Service Organization in the Mail Tribune's Best of the Best. Through the hard work and determination of our team, we have been able to secure over \$60,000 in grant funding which will help us complete a few much needed and long overdue projects.



One of those projects is a remodel of our Adoption Center. It's been a while since any upgrades have been done in the Adoption Center because all of our funds are usually spent directly on the animals. However, in this case the Adoption Center was becoming a safety issue for our staff and visitors. Thanks to a grant from the West Family Foundation we will be able to paint and replace flooring. The project should be completed by the end of September. We hope you will stop by and see the results!

In addition to working on our campus and Adoption Center, we have been busy saving kittens and continuing our TNR program for community cats. So far this year we have found homes for over 230 adorable kittens and 725 dogs and cats!

We couldn't do this without you! Thank you for believing in the work we do at SoHumane. We are forever grateful for your support.

A Saving Train Promise

Every day SoHumane receives requests for help from people desperate to save animals. Many areas in the Pacific Northwest are experiencing a pet overpopulation problem. Since 2005, SoHumane staff and volunteers have made frequent trips to high-kill shelters, driving hundreds of miles through Oregon and California to bring back dogs who were at death's door due to time and space limitations. Last year the Saving Train program transferred more than 850 dogs and cats from overcrowded shelters to SoHumane.

It's not easy to visit the shelters. The animals who are loaded on the Saving Train are the lucky ones. Their future is bright, and their potential for a forever home is guaranteed. **Your gifts provide food, shelter and veterinary care for these pets who are homeless.** People from all over Southern Oregon come to the SoHumane Adoption Center to adopt and offer a second chance for the dogs and cats who are in our care.

Healthy Mouth, Happy Pet

Oral health is an important component of your pet's overall wellness. People generally have a complete oral health care routine – brushing, flossing, mouthwash, visits to the dentist, and so forth. Does your pet have a well-rounded oral health plan?

Your pet's oral cavity should be examined thoroughly by a veterinarian at each annual exam. Your veterinarian will check the teeth and gums, look for foreign material or growths, and assess the odor of the mouth, as halitosis is often the first indicator of an unhealthy oral cavity.

In addition to having your veterinarian check your pet's mouth, it is also a good idea for you to get in the habit of periodically looking inside the mouth. Assess for any of the following, as they are symptoms of oral disease:

- bad breath
- gums that look inflamed or bleed easily
- teeth that are discolored or loose
- visible build-up of tartar
- chewing on only one side of the mouth
- lumps or bumps in the mouth
- increase in saliva

The number one thing you can do at home to improve oral health is to brush your pet's teeth. Needless to say, this is much more feasible for a dog than a cat! You can purchase pet toothbrushes and toothpaste. Brushing even two or three times a week will improve your pet's oral health significantly.

If brushing is not possible, treats can be an effective way to help maintain oral health. The Veterinary Oral Health Council (VOHC) awards their seal to products that have undergone studies and been proven to retard plaque and tartar on teeth. A list of VOHC-accepted chews, dental

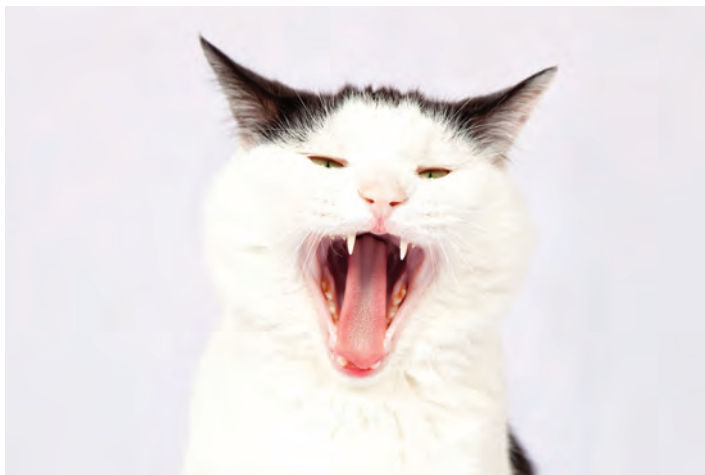
Let's look at what causes disease within your pet's mouth. Without routine oral cleaning, soft dental plaque builds up on teeth around the gumline. Plaque is full of bacteria that starts to invade the gumline and cause an infection in the bone surrounding the teeth. Plaque and minerals in saliva combine to harden into tartar (also called calculus). Tartar forms within days if a tooth is not kept clean and it further attracts plaque. This vicious cycle continues to damage gums and underlying bone, leading to what is called periodontal disease.



Because the tooth is like an iceberg, with a large portion below the gumline, it is often difficult to see periodontal disease. However, American Veterinary Dental College studies have shown that by age three, most cats and dogs have some degree of periodontal disease. Periodontal disease includes gingivitis (inflammation of the gums) and periodontitis (loss of bone and soft tissue around the teeth). Periodontal disease can cause serious health concerns including development of fistulas (holes) up into the nasal cavity, resulting in nasal discharge; fractures of the jaw due to weakening of the bone from bone loss or bone infection; and seeding of the heart, liver or kidneys with bacteria from the mouth that gets into the bloodstream.

An anesthetized assessment of the oral cavity done by your veterinarian is necessary to address periodontal disease, and if done frequently enough is the best way to prevent periodontal disease from occurring in the first place. Many pets do not need such a procedure until they are five or six years old, while others, especially small breed dogs, require more frequent assessments.



Talk to your veterinarian regarding appropriate dental care for your pet. Remember, prevention is key and you are an important part of your pet's dental care routine!

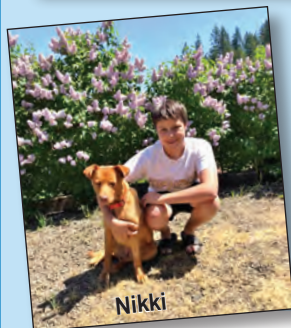


Peanut Butter

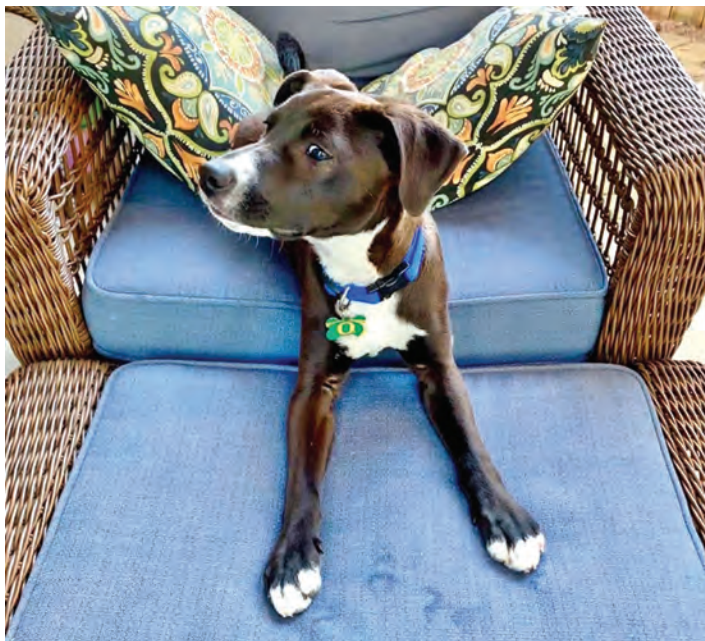
A New Addition To Our Family
