Six months ago, we could not have imagined what the world would look like today. We have experienced things in 2020 no one ever thought possible. Just a few weeks ago our team was forced to evacuate all 83 pets at SoHumane two days in a row due to the fires burning in our area. Watching our staff and volunteers put themselves at risk to rescue the animals here was remarkable, and something I will never forget. Thanks to the incredible first responders in our community the shelter was not damaged.



In April we made the difficult decision to postpone our annual fundraising event, A Toast for Tails. And in late July we were forced to completely reimagine how the event would be held. We decided to throw a drive-through auction preview party for our sponsors and ticket holders along with an online auction open to everyone. I am delighted to say the event was a huge success for the animals. We were able to raise over \$200,000!

Despite the challenges we have faced, you can rest assured that we have been busy loving and caring for the animals. The Saving Train is running, and we are finding homes for all of the precious animals that arrive at our campus. Whether they are rescued from an overcrowded shelter in danger of euthanasia or their guardian is no longer able to care for them, the dogs and cats are safe at SoHumane thanks to your unwavering support.

Although we face uncertain times, we will always be there for the animals! Thank you for your support. It means more now than ever!

Be Prepared! Planning for Disaster

Pets are members of our family. As we head into the cooler, shorter days of winter and are faced with much more time indoors, take the time to get an important project done: emergency preparedness planning for your pets. Those of us living on the West Coast have unfortunately recently experienced that disasters such as wildfires can impact anyone, anywhere, at any time. Be prepared!

The following list is a good place to start when planning your preparedness kit. Let's talk about some details from a veterinary perspective.

Pet Identification

Current, reliable pet identification is absolutely necessary to protect your pet. Microchips are excellent permanent identification devices. Once implanted in your pet, they provide a unique, permanent identification number. As long as you maintain correct contact information with the microchip company, your pet will always be able to be traced back to you if scanned for a microchip. Make sure you and your vet have your pet's microchip number on record.

Collars and identification tags are also very valuable, but remember those can be lost or destroyed during a disaster. A more reliable option is a personalized collar with your contact information actually embroidered onto the collar itself. In addition, consider harnesses for your pet, which are a significantly more secure option than leashes.

Also remember that many animals that survive disasters -- wildfires, for example -- no longer look anything like what they did prior. Fur color and markings are often the way we most easily identify our pets. However, after a wildfire, fur and whiskers may be singed or burned off and ear tips may be damaged, making the pet look very, very different. After wildfires in Northern California in 2018, many pets were only reunited with their owners via microchip identification and not by visual recognition.



Vaccinations

Keep your pet current on vaccinations, especially rabies vaccinations. All dogs in the United States over four months of age are required to be vaccinated for rabies. Although not legally required at this time for cats in Oregon, a current rabies vaccine can be a lifesaver in more ways than one for your cat. If your cat or dog becomes injured or lost during a disaster and bites a human during rescue attempts without being current on rabies vaccination, they may be required to undergo a four-month quarantine period or be euthanized.

Medical Treatment Authorization

Consider preparing a written document that authorizes medical treatment for your pet in your absence. Be specific about what you would or would not like done and how much you are willing to spend before the vet needs to contact you. It is wise to leave a copy with your veterinarian and keep a copy with your pet's medical records. This saves precious time if your pet presents in an emergency situation without you present -- your veterinarian can focus immediately on stabilizing your pet versus spending time trying to determine your wishes while faced with a critical emergency.

Fostering with SoHumane!



SoHumane shelters more than 1,500 dogs and cats each year, and many receive needed care in volunteer foster homes. Foster volunteers provide a temporary home for dogs and cats that need veterinary treatment, a break from the shelter environment to de-stress, and puppies/kittens that are not old enough to be made available for adoption. Foster volunteers provide a clean, safe, loving environment for these pets and help prepare them for adoption.

Kitten fostering makes up the bulk of SoHumane’s fostering needs. Kitten season, generally ranging from March to October, brings hundreds of kittens. Many of these kittens are under eight weeks of age and require placement in foster homes. Some litters of kittens are only days old when they arrive at the shelter. Foster families that nurture these kittens allow SoHumane to save hundreds of kittens every year!

When Sweets needed a second and a third chance, **you were there to help.** Sweets arrived on the Saving Train in November of 2018. A young dog, she was believed to be deaf. But like her name, Sweets was just as sweet as she could be. Quickly adopted, Sweets was soon returned. Once again she was adopted, but returned a few months later. Sweets was now confused, anxious, and somewhat cautious of people.

The dedicated team at SoHumane showered her with love and attention while consistently using training methods to teach her sight commands. They built her confidence and trust. Sweets was placed with a foster family who continued her training. She gained confidence as she mastered simple commands. A great home was suggested, and now Sweets is living a happily-ever-after life. Her adopter shared, "She's doing really well and has settled in. I've kept her name although most of the time I call her Sweetie Pie."

Most of the pets that arrive on the Saving Train are from shelters faced with too many pets and not enough adopters. Others are transferred because like Sweets, they have conditions that are considered a barrier to adoption or are in need of lifesaving medical care. At SoHumane there is never a limit on how long

a pet can stay while waiting for their new home. **Thank you for providing second chances for pets like Sweets.**

Mickey, a beautiful ten year old Siamese cat with the most enticing eyes, had been overlooked at SoHumane for a long time. Mickey had diabetes that required daily insulin shots and a special diet. His needs were simple, and his medications easily managed. Mickey caught the eye of a wonderful SoHumane foster family that was willing to love him until he could find his forever home. They brought out his personality and found his hidden talent of posing for pictures while dressed in many different outfits. He was a cool cat that even had his own Instagram account! His foster family said "Mickey is a wonderful cat with so much love to give".
